EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

Today's Scripture Readings

FIRST READING: Peter is an eyewitness: The Lord is risen (Acts 10:34a, 37-43).

PSALM: Let us be joyful in this day of the Lord (Psalm 118).

SECOND READING: All who are baptized, set your hearts in heaven (Colossians 3:1-4)

GOSPEL: Three witnesses, Mary, Peter, and John; each responds to the empty tomb (John 20:1-9).

LITURGICAL REFLECTION: REJOICE AND BE GLAD

If Christmas is the "most wonderful time of the year," then Easter is the most joyous, glorious, awesome time of the year! Really? Today's readings don't exactly brim over with the kind of holiday cheer we find at Christmas—except for the responsorial psalm, which admittedly rings with gleeful joy. But otherwise, not so much. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter gives a dry, condensed rendering of the story of Jesus to a group of Gentiles in Caesarea. The Colossians reading actually does have us looking forward to glory. Most underwhelming, though, is the Gospel proclamation of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. When we want to hear about angels and earthquakes and trumpets and glory, we hear about a dark, silent, empty tomb. This Easter Sunday story from John's Gospel is startling in its emptiness. Like Peter in the story, we must enter into this mystery.

Easter Sunday

Today's gospel instructs us Jesus "had to rise from the dead." The dying we experience with unmet expectations in marriage and parenting is normal to family life. Families must rise above disappointments and be Easter people all year long.



Dearly Beloved in Christ,

Easter is the most glorious celebration of the whole year! Some may not think so. They remember most of all Christmas, Birthdays, New Year's Day and yes Halloween. None of these compare with Easter Sunday. It commemorates Christ's rising from the dead. Three days earlier he was crucified and died, buried at the hands of his Mother Mary and a few Apostles. Then placed in a burial tomb of Joseph of Arimathea. A huge rock was placed in front. Soldiers were reported to be watching the tomb.

Now, very early in the morning women came to anoint his body with spices as was the custom. The tomb was empty. Later on that day when Mary came to tell the frightened Apostles Jesus had risen, the tomb was empty, but the burial cloths were there. The Apostles gathered in safe room. That evening Jesus appears to them. Other disciples on a walk to the town of Emmaus were talking about all the events that occurred near Jerusalem. Then Jesus, whom they did not recognize walked with them. As it was getting dark, they asked him to stay and eat with them. When he took the bread and wine, they recognized Him.

Christ has Risen, Christ has truly Risen!

An Easter Message from Bishop Mark

"Alleluia is certainly an appropriate word at Easter since it is a word of praise for the great mystery of the Resurrection of our Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. It is because of that great mystery of faith that we can say: 'We are an Easter People.' At the same time, we do not pretend that life is limited to happiness and beauty. We are aware of darkness and sin, poverty and death, war and human suffering around the world. But we also know and believe that Jesus has conquered sin and passed through his own pain and death to the glory of the Resurrection. We live in the light of his Paschal Mystery - the mystery of his Death and Resurrection. As an Easter people, we don't try to ignore the presence of sin, which drains the joy out of our hearts. As an Easter people we look to the Risen Christ who proclaimed, 'I am the resurrection and the life; the one who believes in me will live, even if he dies.'"
