FIRST READING: They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak in different

tongues (Acts 2:1-11).

<u>PSALM:</u> Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth (Psalm 104).

SECOND READING: There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit

(1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13) or Galatians 5:16-25.

GOSPEL: As the Father has sent me, so I send you: Receive the Holy Spirit

(John 20:19-23)

LITURGICAL REFLECTION. . .. Pentecost literally means 50th. It is a feast celebrated on the 50th day after the Passover feast by the Jews, and it is a feast celebrated on the 50th day after the feast of the Resurrection of Jesus by the Christians. The Jewish Pentecost was originally a post-harvest thanksgiving feast. Later, the Jews included in it the remembrance of God's Covenants with Noah after the Deluge and with Moses at Mt. Sinai. Pentecost (Whitsunday), with Christmas and Easter, ranks among the great feasts of Christianity. On Christmas we celebrate the birthday of Christ in His Physical Body. Today is the birthday of the Church, of all those who have been reborn into His Mystical Body. When we believe and trust in Jesus, we have that Faith through the Holy Spirit's work in us and the Holy Spirit filling us. The Holy Spirit leads us to turn away from our sinfulness and reassures us that we are still loved in spite of our sin and that Jesus died on a cross just for those moments when we rebel against God's way. He confronts us and urges us to take a good look at ourselves and where we are heading, to make a U-turn, to leave the old behind and try something new. He's not afraid to challenge us and stretch us to go and do things for Christ - things we have never done before or ever imagined ourselves doing. He's the One Who says to us, "Stop being so self-focused. Stop looking into yourself all the time and being depressed by what you see or fool yourself into thinking that what you see in yourself is enough to get you through! Look up, look away, look to Jesus and let him turn your around; let him take control!"
