November 2, 2025

FIRST READING: The souls of the just are in the hands of God, and no torment

shall touch them (Wisdom 3:1-9 (1)).

<u>LITURGICAL REFLECTION</u> *This year* All Souls' Day falls on a Sunday. Catholics traditionally pray for the dead that they find mercy and peace with God. In the earthly liturgy we take part in a foretaste of that heavenly liturgy celebrated in the holy city of Jerusalem. At Mass we sing a hymn to the Lord's glory with the whole company of heaven, venerating the memory of the saints and hoping for some part and fellowship with them. The liturgy is the source for achieving in the most effective way possible human sanctification. We pray that our dead be with God in heaven.
