FIRST READING: I saw water flowing out of the temple; wherever the river flows, every living

<u>LITURGICAL REFLECTION:</u> Today the Church commemorates the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, the cathedral church of Rome. The Church is the Lord's beloved Bride who calls to him and through him offers worship to the eternal Father. In the liturgy the whole public worship is performed by the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, that is, the Head and his members. Every liturgical celebration, because it is an action of Christ the Priest and of his Body which is the Church, is a sacred action surpassing all others. No other action of the Church can equal the effectiveness of liturgy.

Stewardship Reflections: Today's readings challenge us to focus on the "why" of stewardship. Why embrace this challenging way of life when it seems hard enough just to pay the bills, take care of our loved ones, meet the demands of our jobs, and fall into bed at the end of each full day? Because this life is not all there is. We were made for more - for eternal happiness in union with God. While we cannot earn our way into Heaven, what we do now with the life God has given us has eternal consequences. Stewardship living helps us to keep focused on our hoped-for destination in the choices we make each day.

In our Gospel passage from Luke, Christ reminds us very clearly that we were made for more than just this life and that our choices in this life have eternal consequences. In this passage, our Lord corrects some Sadducees for their mistaken notion that there is no resurrection. He instructs that "those who are deemed worth to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead... can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise."

We should embrace the stewardship way of life to thank God for all His gifts to us and so that we may attain the gift of eternal life and the everlasting happiness of Heaven with Him.
