SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST

Today's Scripture Readings

FIRST READING: Never forget the Lord your God, who brought you out of slavery and fed you with manna in the desert (Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a).

PSALM: Praise the Lord, Jerusalem (Psalm 147).

SECOND READING: Because the loaf of bread is one, we who partake of it, though we are many, are one body (1 Corinthians 10:16-17).

GOSPEL: Jesus said, "I am the living bread; whoever eats this bread will live forever" (John 6:51-58).

LITURGICAL REFLECTION: Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it is distributed under both kinds. From the first days of the Church's celebration of the Eucharist, Holy Communion consisted of the reception of both species in fulfillment of the Lord's command to "take and eat...take and drink." The distribution of Communion to the faithful under both kinds was the norm for more than a millennium of Catholic liturgical practice. For in this form the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident and expression is given to the divine will by which the new and eternal Covenant is ratified in the Blood of the Lord. C.f. General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 2011, Number 281. Norms for the Distribution and Reception of Holy Communion under Both Kinds in the Diocese of United States of America, 2112, Numbers 17-20.
